Individuals outside the United States must pay in US funds by credit card, by check drawn on a US bank, or by International Money Order. Memberships and subscriptions are non-transferable.

You will be enrolled as a member of the Paleontological Society and you will receive its two journals on-line, as well as print subscriptions you have elected to the *Journal of Paleontology* and *Paleobiology*, for the entire 2010 calendar year, regardless of the month in which your application is submitted.

Please allow 30 days for processing of your order and activation of your password. Your **UserID is your account number**, which will be sent to you by email and, if you are a new member, by regular mail. This number also appears on your journal mailing labels and renewal notices. **Your password is your last name, all in capital letters.**
